

Troop 122 notes

Each patrol's quartermaster must report to the Troop's equipment chair the meeting following each campout to have their patrol box inspected and signed off on. The quartermaster will also be responsible to store the patrol box, dry box and cooler until needed. Any items that need to be replaced will be done by the quartermaster and then the cost shall be divided amongst the patrol. Quartermasters must also make sure that the Scout doing the shopping receives the dry box and cooler the meeting before the event.

It is the patrol leader's responsibility to make sure that all of the Scouts in your patrol are fulfilling all of their advancement requirements while we are camping, such as cooking, knot tying, first aid, etc. It is also your responsibility to keep the Scouts in your patrol organized and orderly, if you find yourself having a problem with them please see one of the Scoutmasters.

At the Troop's patrol leader council meeting patrol leaders are expected to report to the SPL the advancement requirements that the Scouts in your patrol need to work on to advance so that it can be incorporated into upcoming meetings. This information should be gathered at your monthly patrol meetings. You should also come to the meeting prepared to offer ideas and activities for our upcoming Troop meetings.

Patrol leaders will be responsible to collect all paper work during attendance and hand it in to the SPL, the SPL will then document who handed paper work in sort it and distribute it to the proper persons. It will also be the responsibility of the SPL to follow up with patrol leaders regarding missing paperwork.

Patrol leaders are responsible to collect and record the \$10 handed in with permissions slips. You must also make sure that the Scout responsible for shopping receives the money and furnishes a receipt after the event.

Troop instructors need to stay in contact with the SPL in order to allow time to properly prepare and execute the program they are to present at the Troop meetings. Troop instructors must also allocate time during meetings to assist Scouts who may be having difficulty with a certain skill.

Troop guides are expected to work with the new Scouts during our weekly meetings as well as on our campouts to make sure that the Scouts adjust to our Troop and to ensure that they advance in a timely manner. You are the ambassadors of the Troop and are expected to live by the Scout oath and law at all times and set the example for the new Scouts.

All Scouts in Troop 122 are expected to advance in a timely manner, while this is your responsibility you will be assisted by the Scoutmasters and your fellow Scouts. I would like to remind you to have your Scout handbook with you at all times and as soon as

you finish a requirement have it signed off as soon as possible. Also please be aware that there is no way to replace a lost book and that any work that you have completed towards your next rank will have to all be verified and or redone. Make sure that you keep your book safe and secure since you will have it with you for the next 7-8 years.

Scoutmasters are expected to make time to review Scout advancement during each meeting ,event and activity. I would also like to see Scoutmasters take a more active role during our meetings an activities, you do not need to be asked or told to help out you already volunteered for that.

Last but certainly not least if anyone feels that they are having a problem, would like to see things done differently or just feel like talking I'm always available and open to suggestions and will handle any problems discreetly.
